### October Minutes

The October Guild meeting was held at the Natchez Trace Crafts Center in conjunction with the Craftsmen's Guild's Pioneer Festival. Guild members brought spinning wheels, looms, etc. and demonstrated on the front porch in lieu of the regular program. ¶ Hazel announced that the Craftsmen's Guild had given our guild permission to use their address, negating the need for a post office box. **OUR NEW ADDRESS IS:** Chimneyville Weavers' Guild, c/o Chimneyville Craftsmen's Guild, 1150 Lakeland Drive, Jackson, MS 39216. Thank you, Marjorie Bates and Craftsmen's Guild. ¶ There was a reminder, once again, from Hazel that dues are past due. If you are not sure whether you have paid and wish to remain a member, please contact Hazel Howell or send her your dues. ¶ Chimneyville Crafts Festival needs were discussed. Hazel needs stand-by volunteers (1) for each day. Let her know if you can help out. She also reminded everyone to work on angels and stated that we need about 300 ornaments - 20 per person? This will be a bigger tree than last year. If you are not helping set-up, bring your ornaments to the November guild meeting or take to Jo Lynn Vaughn at the Craftsmen's Guild to hold for Hazel. (Thanks, Jo Lynn.) ¶ The DGB show was discussed and it was discovered that none of us had sent Gerry any information re: numbers of pieces we could show. Shame on us! (More later in newsletter from Gerry.) Debbie Stringer read the press release for the DGB show and showed pictures of Sheep-to-Shawl that could be used in the show. It was announced that take-down had been changed from Monday to Sunday. One display technique from Sharron Williams: cover foam core with black fabric and attach with T-pins on the back. ¶ It was brought up to place on the docket for next month discussion of a new logo. We would also discuss making flyers to give out at different functions. ¶ Spinners' corner: Rental price for the drum carder is \$10 for the first month, \$5 per month thereafter if no one else wants it. (This is for guild members only.) Outline for the spinning class was handed out by Tina to those participating.

## Notes from Gerry re: DGB show

PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY if you want to participate in our December show at Deposit Guaranty National Bank. Check your calendar to see if you can help with the HANGING on Sunday, December 2, 2:30. Details will be worked out at our next meeting. Items for the show may be brought to the meeting or sent to Gerry Reiff, 810 Fairview, Jackson, MS 39202, to arrive by November 26. Call if you want to deliver (948-1948). The Guild cannot assume responsibility for loss or damage. DGNB doesn't either, but they provide a guard.

REGULATIONS say the piece may not protrude beyond the edges of the panel nor more than 3" outward. We will have 28 panels made of fabric over 3/8" cork over 5/8" plywood. The 4 largest are nearly 6' by 7'; 20 panels are 4' wide by 7' high; 4 are inside booths and measure 5-1/2' by 3-1/2'.

With each piece include a 3 X 5 card, typed or neatly printed, with your name, fabric description, and, if you want to sell, price and phone number. We will have push pins, nails and picture hooks, but YOUR PIECE MUST BE "HANGING READY." That means: include any hardware needed, like dowels, and if the piece is heavy, like a rug, have casing attached to it and insert the dowel. Be sure EVERYTHING you want back has your name firmly attached.

The UNHANGING will be Sunday, December 29, at 2:30. If you can't be there to get yours it will be at the January meeting. If you can't get it then, ARRANGE FOR SOMEONE ELSE to get it, or Gerry may decide you meant it for her!
