- <u>Previous minutes</u> were approved with the following corrections: February program is a spinning program, and the March program will be knitting the chemo hats.
- The new Directory was sent electronically in January. Those with difficulty downloading were provided with hard copies.
- * *Debbie Stringer* was belatedly presented with her pin for being a past President of the CWSG, with grateful appreciation for her work.

Sharon also had a bill for her own pin, which she would give to Sandra. (Sandi Tucker suggested we order 4 or 5 at a time to have them ready for outgoing presidents ...)

- A gentle reminder that some folks still owed dues. Kathy volunteered to check with some members and let Sandra know status.
- Several members who attended Roc Day shared some of their experiences.
- Continuing search for meeting place and urgently looking for a place for Library (presently in Barbara Mitchell's garage). Several suggestions were made as to where to house our Library and hold meetings:
- $\sqrt{}$ New Craft Ctr. is interested in having us if we can pay a yearly fee and have volunteers staff the center for certain days. We could keep our Library there.

- \sqrt{A} motion was made and seconded to have Kathy Cohron find out about prices for various storage possibilities for the Library, in case we did not find suitable place for our meetings.
- As a wrap up of old business, leading into new business, Sharon appointed a committee to write a proposal to find a regular meeting place as well as a permanent place for our Library. Members of the committee: Synnove Heggoy, Hazel Howell, and Sandi Tucker, who will meet on the 27th at Hazel's house to write the proposal. Marva Goodman will serve as a resource. In addition, they had looked up the tartans (and sett) of members who gave them their family clan names. All who were able to attend greatly enjoyed the presentation and then actually trying their hand at weaving several different kinds of tartans, which Hazel and Sandra had set up. Among other things we learned, "Now a legal registry exits: VESTARIUM SCOTICUM. You can now design and register your own tartan." Great job!
